

How do I apply for food assistance?



#### What is SNAP?

SNAP is a federal program that provides food-assistance based on household income. Those enrolled in SNAP receive a monthly stipend loaded onto a payment card—much like a credit card—and can use this money to buy food products from most food retailers.

Formerly known as food stamps, SNAP stands for Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program.

### Who qualifies?

SNAP eligibility is based on your monthly income, expenses and the size of your household family. Not sure if you qualify? Refer to the chart below.



1 person	\$1,265	5 people	\$3,024
2 people	\$1,705	6 people	\$3,464
3 people	\$2,144	7 people	\$3,904
4 people	\$2,584	8 people	\$4,344



## How can SNAP help me?

- SNAP benefits allow you to spend less money on food, freeing up more of your income for other critical monthly expenses.
- The SNAP card can be used to buy food at most major grocery stores, select convenience stores, and even some farmers' markets.
- If used wisely, SNAP can help you improve the nutritional content of your meals.

SNAP provides **supplemental nutrition** for working families, seniors, and other Marylanders who qualify for the assistance. It is NOT intended to be a substitute for regular monthly income and cannot meet all of recipients' nutritional needs.

## What is SNAP Outreach?

The SNAP Outreach Program is a Maryland Food Bank initiative that sends trained staff into local communities to help eligible Marylanders sign up for SNAP benefits.

While the Maryland Food Bank is not affiliated with the government's SNAP program, our SNAP Outreach workers can help individuals determine their eligibility, gather the necessary documentation, and navigate the SNAP application process.

In short, the program acts as a bridge between applicants, the Department of Social Services, and the SNAP benefits that these applicants are entitled to.

# What documents do I need to bring?

When attending a SNAP Outreach event, please bring as many of the below documents as possible:

- picture ID
- social security card
- social security benefits award letter
- birth certificate
- pension (if you receive one)
- most recent BGE bill (if you pay)
- water bill (if you pay)
- recent pay stubs
- mortgage statement (if you pay)
- property tax (if you pay)
- homeowners insurance bill (if you pay)
- pharmacy bills (\$35 or more)
- supplemental health insurance forms (if you pay)
- · receipts of co-payments to doctors
- day care bills (if you pay)
