



Make a Bequest Gift

Providing a gift through your will, retirement plan, or insurance policy is one of the simplest ways to support the Maryland Food Bank. After your lifetime, your gift will continue to support a cause that has been important to you and will extend the legacy of your values.

Below are a sample of the types of bequests you can use in your will or estate plan.

Percentage Bequest. Name a percentage of your estate that you want to leave to the Maryland Food Bank.

Specific Bequest. Name a specific dollar amount or named assets (e.g., securities) that you want to leave to the Maryland Food Bank.

Residuary Bequest. This type of bequest is honored after all other bequests have been made, and all debts, expenses and taxes have been paid.

Contingent Bequest. Name the Maryland Food Bank as a contingent recipient if your primary beneficiary does not survive you.
